



Rules for Visitation:

- Limit to **2** visitors at a time, and visitations are limited to **30 minutes** (please arrive 10 minutes early to allow time for screening process, temperature check and to sign waiver). If you arrive any earlier, you must wait in your vehicle.
- Visitors and residents **must sign an informed consent for each visit** to inform you of the possible dangers of COVID-19 and you will follow the rules set by the facility in regards to outdoor visitation. 
- **Visitors must restrict physical contact (no hand shaking, hugging, kissing etc.). Must maintain at least 6 feet distancing during the entire visit.**
- Visitors and residents must wear a face covering or mask (and any other PPE deemed necessary by the facility) during the visit.
- Face covering must cover the nose and mouth at all times during the visit and until visitor exits the premises. 
- You will be instructed on good hand hygiene prior to your visit and when you are screened, you will be asked to use hand sanitizer.
- **Please understand that a designated staff member is required to remain with the resident at all times during your visit.**
- Visitors must remain in the designated area for the visit during the entire visit and must not wander around for

any reason (There will be a designated restroom for you to use if you require to do so during your visit).

- Visitors may bring their own water for themselves during the visit, but this **CANNOT** be shared with the resident.



Visitors may not bring in any beverages

or food for the resident during the visit! Unopened food may be left at the front desk for your loved one and must be labeled.

- **If you feel you will not be able to adhere to any of the above, your visit will be cancelled or terminated.** Please remember this is not punitive in any way, we are required to ensure maximum safety during this time.
- Please monitor for any signs of COVID 19 for at least 14 days after visit. If symptoms occur, you are strongly advised to self-isolate at home, contact your health care provider and immediately notify the facility.
