Elections

Worked at DAS in the scheduling office as a student worker, student interpreter, and 1 year in the apprenticeship program. Now I am a staff interpreter for DAS; I was on the Liberal Arts team and recently have switched to PD team. Currently working on my MBA and will finish in 2022. In recent years, I have been serving as Treasurer for GVRRID and now I am running for President.

 - Growing up, met a few Deaf people, picked up some signs here and there. During high school, I started socializing with other Deaf students where I was given my sign name. Took some time after high school, got married. In 2006, I went back to college for interpreting. Went to University of Northern Florida, was involved in their RID chapter. In the middle of my term there as president, I moved to Rochester for the Apprenticeship program. After the Apprenticeship was over, my husband and I decided to move officially to Rochester. I've been here working ever since. I have recently switched over to being a full time freelance interpreter so that I can better support the areas that need it.
 - Emily Call Running for Treasurer
 - Moved to Rochester in 2007, was taking an ASL class as a foreign language. My Deaf professor told me to go become an interpreter so I transferred to RIT. Worked at DAS in the scheduling office, then as a student interpreter, and then onto the Apprenticeship program. Now I am a staff interpreter for DAS. I also have a Masters degree from RIT in business. Life has been very busy but I can now be able to give back to this community. I enjoy dealing with money and money management so when I was asked if I wanted to run for treasurer, I said sure!
 - Keven Poore Running for Deaf member at Large.
 - Work at NTID, teaching students there, and as Director of Substance Abuse and Addiction Intervention. Originally I wanted to become a vet but

when it came time to go to school, I went for psychology instead. Started working with behavior health. At that time, a bachelors wasn't enough to become a counselor so I went back to school at Gallaudet for my Masters. I moved to Rochester with my wife. My ties to interpreting is, as a consumer of course, but also when I moved here I noticed there was a lack of quality interpreters, especially in the DeafBlind area. So I went to NYC to do the CDI training, finished that, came back and worked as a CDI. Worked at the hospital and as a freelance interpreter.

Randleman Program Presentation - Amberlee Jones and Cassandra Flores

- Thank you for letting me be here to talk about the Randleman Program
- Vision
 - To recruit and retain interpreters of color across the field of interpreting
- Mission
 - To create a protege lead pathway program that focuses on interpreting, intersectionality, and diversity.
- Started 2019, had preceptorships to really look at and address gaps for interpreters of color in their training.
 - Typically IOCs don't join training programs or don't stay
 - We started a 2 year program for IOCs
- Named after Valerie Randleman
 - First Black interpreter at DAS. She really touched a lot of lives while working there and created a space for non-white interpreters to feel safe and welcome.
- Gerry Buckly tasked Angela Hauser to help figure out a way to recruit and retain IOCs.
 - Angela went to high schoolers to try and get them to come and join interpreting but saw it wasn't enough so we established the RP
- Stats
 - o Back in 2018, RID wanted to have more numbers about their membership.

- o 2020.
- RID wise, the numbers haven't changed much because while more IOCs are certified more people in general are getting certified so the percentages aren't changing like they should.
- 4 different pillars of the program
 - IMI Integrated Model of Interpreting
 - Language Development
 - Diversity, Inclusion, and Equity
 - Professional Development
- What to expect
 - Weekly colloquiums
 - Talk about assignment, what's happening, discussion.
 - Weekly small group
 - Discussion about Diversity, Equity, and inclusions.
 - Weekly Preceptor Meeting
 - Meeting with your preceptor to chat, this time is flexible depending on what your relationship is with your preceptor.
 - Weekly Coreteam meeting
 - Interpreting a minimum of 12 hours a week
 - Can pick up more hours once you get going
 - Virtual Social Gatherings
- Summer Intensive Program
 - Created as a result of COVID
 - Wanted to keep developing and encouraging a network of IOCs
 - This program exploded.
 - Posted on Social Media and it was shared thousands of times.
 - o In 2 hours, we had over 50 applicants!
 - This is completely free, fully online.
 - It's hard to ask people to uproot themselves for 2 years, leave their home and family, it can be especially hard for People of Color
 - This is a great opportunity for them since it is online.
- Future?
 - Will have the summer intensive program
 - Will have a new cohort for 2021
 - Currently developing a Remote Mentoring program
 - We want to train more mentors of color to help them spread and recruit in their areas.
 - Developing a Summer intensive Deaf Interpreters of Color
 - Had a lot of questions from Deaf people of Color to see if they could join, we didn't feel it was appropriate for us to be teaching Deaf people
 - So we have started networking with other Deaf Interpreters of Color to set this up in the future.
- Endowment for Interpreter Certification

- Certification can become a barrier for interpreters. Wanted to figure out how to better support people get over this barrier so we started an Endowment.
- First preference for who gets it?
 - Randleman Program Proteges, apprentices, alumni, Deaf IOCs
- Second:
 - Students of Color.
- Will also not just be for the NIC, also for State licensure and BEI and EPIA.
- Need about \$25,000
 - NTID's endowment are matched by federal government
 - Establishes a fund that will continue forever
 - 5 IOCs a year
 - Gift will be spread throughout the three years
 - Matched also by Interpretek
 - If people give more money, then we can just increase and develop this program more.
