**DEBRA A. LITTERE, ASSESSOR :** The Assessment Equity Project for 2026 is nearing completion. The project's goal is to continue to provide **fair and equitable** property assessments ensuring that each property owner is apportioned their fair share of the property tax levy. At the end of March, the Assessment Disclosure Notices will be mailed to all property owners in the Town. We are confident that our office, along with GAR Associates LLC, have ensured that the new assessments meet New York State's requirement to arrive at 100% equity.

**DID YOU KNOW...** if you reside in Cambria, are 65 years of age or older, and your total household income is less than \$33,700 (2025 Income tax return needed), you may be eligible for an additional exemption on county, town, or school taxes. Please contact our office for more information.

As the March 1<sup>st</sup> deadline for all exemptions has passed, we thank everyone for getting their paperwork to us in a timely manner. Anyone turning 65 years of age, this year or next, may qualify for Enhanced STAR benefits. There is no need to provide proof, unless the STATE requests it.

High School Seniors interested in applying for a scholarship from the Niagara County Assessor's Association should inquire at their high school guidance office. Deadline is April 1<sup>st</sup>!

**DEBRA A. LITTERE, TAX COLLECTOR :** The last day to pay taxes is **Tuesday, March 31<sup>st</sup>, 2026.** From 8:00am–12:00pm and 1:00pm – 3:30pm. If you can't make it on that day, please drop your payment at the post office, it must be postmarked (HAND STAMPED) **March 31<sup>st</sup>, 2026.** There is also a drop box outside the front doors to the Town Hall that is checked daily and will be checked at **3:30pm March 31<sup>st</sup>, 2026!**

**MATTHEW COOPER, BUILDING INSPECTOR:** The new year has brought some changes to the department. All the updated New York State building codes have come out. Please bear with me as I become more familiar with these changes. As it stands at the time of writing this, the initiative for NY to become all electric has been put on hold. If your project requires a permit and you plan to do the work yourself, you must fill out the Certificate of Attestation of Exemption (CE-200) on [businessexpress.ny.gov](http://businessexpress.ny.gov). A link to the form explaining this can be found on our department website. The Town now has its own GIS website to offer residents some helpful information. It shows road jurisdictions, responding fire departments, zoning, and parcel information. You can find the link on the Home page of the [TownofCambria.Gov](http://TownofCambria.Gov) website. Our department continues to strive to ensure our Town is a safe and appealing place to live. To accomplish this, we need the efforts of all residents to maintain their property per the Town's Property Maintenance Local Law and the New York State Property Maintenance Code. Properties should have regularly maintained lawns and be kept clear of debris. I routinely patrol our Town noting violations and notifying property owners of existing violations, requesting they correct the matter promptly. As always, this is a good time to check your carbon monoxide/smoke detectors to ensure they are in proper working order. I look forward to assisting you with your spring and summer projects and hope you have a productive home improvement season!

**REFUSE INFORMATION:** Garbage day is **Thursday** (unless the following holidays occur during the week: New Years Day, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Thanksgiving and Christmas Day). Pick-up will be on **Friday** those weeks. Recycling Day is every other Thursday. See the **Town of Cambria Collection calendar** on the town's website for the recycling day in your neighborhood. Too much garbage for your tote? We have options: Purchase 5 sticker tags for \$25.00 (cash only) this will allow you to put 5 extra bags at the curb. Bags tagged for collection cannot exceed 30 gallons in size or 40 pounds in weight. Request an additional garbage tote: \$85.00 one-time fee plus an additional \$30.00 annually.

**Damaged Tote?** If your garbage or recycling tote is damaged, please reach out to us at 716-433-7664 x114 or email us at [water@townofcambria.com](mailto:water@townofcambria.com). We will arrange to have your tote either repaired or replaced. Garbage and recycling totes remain with the property when you sell your home. **STEVEN KROENING, HIGHWAY SUPERINTENDENT:** As the snow begins to melt and the ground thaws, flooding can become an issue. It is very common for yards to have some temporary standing water and drainage ditches to be at their maximum capacity during the spring thaw. It is advisable to get outside as soon as the weather permits to ensure proper flow and functionality of the drainage system on your property. Sometimes the only reason for additional water is because there is an obstruction somewhere in a ditch or culvert. If there appears to be a bigger problem, please contact our office and we will look at it to see if it is part of the town's responsibility.



Weather permitting, we will begin brush pick up on April 13th. We can accommodate limbs up to 8" in diameter. Please stack limbs neatly with butt ends toward the road. Low spread-out piles are preferred over high piles. To ensure our machinery can efficiently pick up piles please do not stack near mailboxes, street signs & or telephone poles. We will **NOT** take piles that have wire, rope, stakes, roots, root balls, vines, dirt, thorns, or poison ivy in them. We can pick up stumps and root balls with a machine at our convenience. Please make sure to notify us in advance. **We DO NOT PICK UP BRUSH IN THE MONTHS OF JULY & AUGUST.** We utilize the warm summer months to repair our roads. Brush pickup will resume the first week in September and will continue until the end of October. **We no longer pick up brush on any STATE road in the town.** This is due to insurance and liability reasons. Residents may still drop off brush at the Municipal garage. We do not pick up leaves. Mulch is available to all Town residents for pickup. Loading is at our convenience please make sure to notify us in advance.

The Town is **not** obligated to fix or replace mailboxes. As of now, we do it as a courtesy for our residents. It says in **New York State's Highway Law**, "when necessities of keeping the highway open conflict with the reception of mail, the latter must stand aside". In other words, keeping the road clear from snow is more important than making sure your mailbox is standing. Section 319 of New York State's Highway law says mailboxes are technically considered an obstruction and are only allowed to be on the side of the road as a courtesy to the homeowner.

Dropping off electronic recycling? Please visit the Highway Clerk's office in the Municipal garage building to sign in. Electronic Recycling is on Mondays from 8:00am – 2:00pm.

**WATER DEPARTMENT:** **Thank you** to the residents who responded to our request to participate in the Lead and Copper Sampling program. Water samples were collected and tested by Pace Laboratories on behalf of the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and results were submitted to the NYS Department of Health. Participating residents were notified of the results via mail. We are pleased with the results and appreciate the residents' willingness to assist us with this program.



**WATER METERS.** We are continuing to make progress replacing water meters throughout the town. The older meters continue to accurately measure your water consumption; however, they may not be transmitting the usage to us. Therefore, if your meter is older, you aren't being charged for your water consumption, only the minimal cost to have the meter in your home. Please call us to schedule a meter install if you notice 0 (zero) consumption on your water bill. There is no cost to the homeowner for the new meter or installation.

**SELLING YOUR HOME?** Please contact us prior to the closing date so we may schedule a **compliance inspection (716-433-7664 x 114)**. The Town of Cambria Water District Rules and Regulations states that all water service must be equipped with a double check valve. Failure to schedule the compliance inspection may delay your closing date. **Effective February 13, 2025**, the Town of Cambria will charge a **\$300.00 (surcharge)** when the annual tax roll is made for anyone that has a past due water bill over **\$100.00**. Payments can be made at the Town Clerks office Monday – Friday 8:00 am – 4:00 pm, by mailing them to the town hall or use the drop box for after-hours payments. Credit card payments can only be accepted in person. All payments must be received and date stamped by close of business (4:00pm) on the due date. Any payments received after will incur the late fee.

**CAMBRIA TOWN PARK:** As winter draws to a close, we are preparing to begin our annual spring clean up. As always please keep our park clean for everyone, pick up after yourself and your dog! **Remember all pets must be kept on a leash to keep everyone safe (NYS Ag & Markets Law Chapter 69, Article 7 Section 118).** The Town Park has (5) shelters and (1) gazebo available to rent (**reservations are required**) from May through October. **There is a non-refundable rental fee.** Residents and non-residents of the Town may reserve shelters, fees for non-residents are slightly higher. **TAMARA COOPER, TOWN CLERK: Did you know?** According to Article 7 of the New York State Agriculture and Market Law, **all dogs 4 months of age and older** must be licensed within the town in which they reside. Licensing ensures that all dogs have been properly vaccinated against rabies and is necessary to protect both you and your neighbors. If your dog is already licensed, you may renew your dog license on our website. If you need to update your dog's rabies vaccination information you can email a copy of the certificate to us at [townclerk@townofcambria.com](mailto:townclerk@townofcambria.com). **NYS has a leash law!!** Please make sure your dog(s) have a collar on with license tags or identification tags; this makes it much easier to identify your dog(s) and contact the owner if they get loose. Need a NYS hunting or fishing license? Come on in! We sell licenses Monday-Friday from 8:00 am-3:30 pm. We accept cash, check, money order or credit card (there is a convenience fee to use credit cards). The Town Clerk's Office also handles the issuance and renewal of handicap tags; please remember to bring in your NYS driver's license with your application/renewal letter and old tag. **GAIL REINBIRD, TOWN HISTORIAN:** Born on Oct. 26, 1768 in Granville, Hampton County, Mass, Jarius Rose moved to Canandaigua, N.Y. as a young man. There he learned the profession of surveying. He married Zilpa Gillett on Jan.22,1794. Together they had seven children, 3 boys and 4 girls .They left Canandaigua in 1811traveling in an ox cart and horse drawn wagon along what is now Ridge Road. It took them over a week to get to Dickersonville where Zilpha and the children were left to stay with a Mr. Harris. Jarius had bought around 2,000 acres of land for \$250,000 or what was 6 square lots. The land was \$4.50, and then later \$5.00 an acre. One of these lots is where SUNY Niagara College is in Sanborn. Some of the other lots formed a rectangle from the corner of Routes 31 and 429 to Baer Rd, and then through Hoover's field and towards the Sanborn Farm museum on Route 31. Lot 41 began on Upper Mountain Rd. at the Tuscarora Reservation and went down Myers Hill. He surveyed much of the land. Jarius had 3 hired men with him, and they began clearing the way up Myers Hill to where the entrance of the college is on Route 31. They made an opening in the woods there and built a cabin in only 3 days. He later grazed 40 head of cattle and in 1813, planted 2 acres of wheat there. Most notable is his planting of apple trees, making him the 1<sup>st</sup> person to plant a nursery in Niagara County. He later sold trees to other settlers for 12 cents each. The War of 1812 came to Niagara County and in 1813 Jarius was taken captive by Native Americans friendly to the British at Fort Niagara. His horse and clothes were taken, except his shirt, pantaloons and boots. He managed to slip his pocketbook containing \$400.00 into his boot undetected. His captors locked arms on each side of him and forced him to run 5 miles to Lewiston. He was made to run faster by hits to the head with a tomahawk and ramrod of a gun. He was then taken to Canada where a British agent, Nellis, tried to “buy” him, three times. The captors collected \$100.00 each time they returned to demand the return of Jarius, threatening to kill them if the did not. Jarius was hidden in a garret and after 6 weeks was sent with a private escort of soldiers to Buffalo. From there he joined his family that had gone back to Canandaigua because of the war. After the War of 1812 ended, the family returned to Cambria. Jarius sold off some of his lots and continued to develop the rest of his property until his death at the age of 59. He was first buried on the farm and then was moved to Mount View Cemetery. To contact the Town Historian, please text at (716) 336-7455.
