Our Scope of Services

Adult Day Health Care – Health care, social activities and support services. Six days per week.

In-Home Care – Providing care for you or a loved one in the comfort, privacy and safety of your own home.

Mondello Wellness & Family Center – Health screenings, education programs and other wellness-related activities for senior adults and their families.

Nursing Home Care – 24/7 medical care in a beautiful, home-like setting. Our nursing home care also provides:

- **Hospice and Palliative Care** – Comforting and specialized care for those facing a serious or life-limiting illness.
- **Rehab** – Specialized, short-term care for those with recent illness, injury or surgery.

Traumatic Brain Injury – Several programs including waiver services to address the cognitive, physical and emotional aspects of individuals with TBI.

Veteran Care – Services available for veterans at home, those in need of adult day health care, short-term rehab, or skilled nursing care.

A Closer Look:

Schofield Adult Day Health Care Program (ADHCP) was established in 1987. The mission of ADHCP is to provide comprehensive, managed health and rehabilitative services and socialization to eligible individuals living in the community and respite to their caregivers. Schofield's award-winning not-for-profit program is an alternative to institutionalization and helps to prevent and/or reduce hospitalizations and ER visits. Serving adults with disabilities age 18 years and older, the Schofield team offers nursing care, occupational therapy, physical therapy, social service counseling/case management, support groups, nutritional guidance and health care monitoring of blood pressure, blood sugar levels, medication and other health regimes. Schofield's ADHCP is the largest Adult Day Health Care program in upstate NY and is the only one in Erie County that is open with a morning and afternoon session Monday through Friday, and one Saturday session.

Schofield's In-Home Health Care has a long and successful history as a provider of care in the home. Our Certified Home Health Care and Licensed Home Care Agency are both committed to the delivery of high quality, cost effective home care services. We believe that the care of the individual should include the highest level of professional care for their physical, psychological and spiritual needs – a ministry of care to the whole individual. The ultimate aim of our care is to maintain or rehabilitate every individual to enjoy the activities of daily living to their fullest ability.

The Schofield Story

Celebrating 110 Years of Service!

“As time goes on and our institutions grow...nothing should be left undone that in any way would add to their comfort and happiness.” Dr. Jennie Schofield

Dr. Jennie M. Schofield was a graduate of Fredonia State Normal School and the Kirksville, Missouri College of Osteopathy in 1906. She moved to Buffalo with her husband, William, in 1894. Dr. Schofield began her service to the community by loaning wheelchairs to those who could not afford them. Under her leadership, together with a dedicated group of volunteers, the Schofield Story begins.

On May 1, 1910 the Wheel Chair Guild of Buffalo, NY was born. The founders met that day at 199 Hodge St., the home of Dr. Schofield. The Guild’s objective was “to provide wheelchairs free of charge for invalids and convalescents among the worthy poor”. The Guild hoped that “in a short time they would be able to maintain a home for poor unfortunate incurables. Supported entirely by voluntary contributions, entertainments and sales”.

Dr. Schofield called a special meeting July 20, 1911 and the Guild formed its plans to open a Wheel Chair Guild Home. Just a short time later on September 1, 1911, the doors opened at 93 Seventeenth St. in Buffalo. “Success has crowned our efforts” wrote Dr. Schofield. A mere eight months later, the Guild moved to a larger building at 344 Hudson St.

In June 1913, the Wheel Chair Guild Home changed its name to Wheel Chair Home for Incurables. 1916 brought more change as the Wheel Chair Home moved to the Village of Kenmore after purchasing the Eberhardt Mansion located on the corner of Delaware and Kenmore Avenues. The Pierce Arrow Motor Car Company generously moved the Wheel Chair Home to their new building free of charge and provided automobiles to drive patients to their new home. Emergency Hospital donated the use of their ambulance for the patients unable to sit up. Denton, Cottier and Daniels moved the piano and victrola.

On May 17, 1979 we broke ground for our current residence facility at 3333 Elmwood Ave. Kenmore, NY. An official dedication ceremony was held on October 25, 1980, and the new operating name of “Schofield Residence” was introduced to honor Dr. Jennie Schofield. Other notable dates:

- June 1985 – Schofield Residence’s Long Term Home Health Care Program began operating.
- April 1987 – Schofield’s Adult Day Health Care Program opened.
- June 1996 – Schofield Home Health Care Services, Inc. accepted its first patient.
- May 1999 - Schofield Home Health Care Services, Inc. received approval to provide licensed home care services in Niagara County.
- June 2013 – Schofield received approval from the NYS Dept. of Health to convert our Long Term Home Health Care Program to a Certified Home Health Agency (CHHA).

Today Dr. Schofield’s work continues as we strive each and every day to “provide knowledgeable and compassionate care that enhances the lives of those we serve”.
