Bill's Blogs from his recent travels provide the Suiseki inspiration this month. The top photo is from the new Kyoto Bonsai Garden, which opened in March of 2021. "This walkway of stones of opposite the entryway of bonsai created by Maahiko Kimura. Directly opposite these bonsai is a special display of stones, originally from the Saburo Kato Mansei-en Bonsai Garden in Omiya. These stones have been carefully arranged leading visitors from the ancient Chinese taste, the origin of stone appreciation and bonsai, to the contemporary Japanese taste of stones." SHOHIN BONSAI FEATURE OF THE MONTH



Mame Shohin Bonsai, Burning Bush

This Semi-Cascade bonsai almost has everything going for it: 1. Great trunk taper, 2. Perfect proportion between the tree and pot size, 3. Clear Focal Point (the Magenta foliage), and 4. Ramification of twigs. The only problem I have with it, is the foliage in the upper left corner, it is growing back in the opposite direction of the rest of the tree. The base of the tree is moving from left to right, the upper left corner is moving from right to left, creating visual conflict rather than overall harmony of direction. The directional movement of the base of the tree must always be maintained throughout the tree. This can be easily corrected by pruning back the upper left corner foliage. The Magenta foliage and Violet pot are an Analogous color combination. Analogous colors are made up of each other and Harmonize together rather than Color contrasting each other. Although, Analogous colors can have a Light & Dark contrast even though the colors Harmonize.
