January's Carving workshop a great success

On Tuesday, January 25, the BUSNY hosted a "Deadwood/Carving Workshop" from 10AM to 4PM at the Brighton Town Lodge, organized by John Wiessinger and led by our own Society President Mark Arpag. The workshop originally planned for two years ago was cancelled because of a snowstorm. This workshop was definitely worth the wait.

There were 6 Society members in attendance who brought a variety of species for study, styling, and carving of shari and jin. Weeping cherry, spruce, crab apple, juniper, yew, hemlock and others were represented. Mark began with some initial comments on the nature of the workshop and promptly began to consider trees by each participant as we gathered around at the front table for his comments on styling and how to make the most of each tree. After studying each tree for a while, he made suggestions about how the it could be improved through the addition of deadwood to complement the foliage and how the remaining foliage could best be redirected to accentuate the new deadwood to best advantage. He then demonstrated a variety of tools and techniques to achieve the design while we all watched.

For lunch, Mark brought in a tasty bean, ham, and elbow macaroni soup which was enjoyed by everyone prior to starting the afternoon session. Rick Marriott provided liquid refreshment and a welcomed pastry to complete the lunch.

After lunch, the participants worked on their trees to the sounds of Dremeltm tools, grinders, knives, pruners, and scissors. Mark made the rounds, providing additional pointers on how to proceed and leveraging his decades of experience in bonsai to the benefit of the attendees and their trees.

Toward the end of the session, there was one particular tree which was a challenge to the owner. Mark suggested that "I can make this into a tree you'll love in about 15 minutes." He then, with the owner's permission, applied some radical surgery, trimming branches, and removing bark on others to create well placed deadwood. The owner was greatly pleased with the result and those of us who witnessed the expert transformation were content that Mark's prediction was true.

David Knittle table making workshops in February

David Knittle will be conducting two workshops during the day of our February 22nd meeting. The stands and tables will be prefinished. Participants will be assembling them and taking home a quality table that can be used in the highest level exhibitions. David will begin each session with a short description of how they were produced to get them ready for the assembly process.

There are morning and afternoon sessions still available, and those descriptions and pictures are shown below.

Participants will be given a choice on a first-to-register basis. The stands and tables vary in style, type of wood, size, details, and color tone. Please read the descriptions carefully.

Session One - morning. Participants will assemble a two level stand. David's mentor, Bill Valavanis, encouraged him years ago to make this style. Bill has one and says it is one of the most versatile and most often used in his studio. There are three versions available, all 31" x 8.5" x 12" high. The top shelf is 11" x 8.5". These can be used to display shohin or slightly larger bonsai.

Version 1 - 2 are available. This version is not pictured. It is identical in size to the one pictured (*right*) with pseudo bamboo details but without those carved details. Genuine mahogany with a medium dark brown finish. \$290



Version 3 - 2 are available, see picture to left. Walnut with pseudo bamboo carved details on the posts and shelf edges. Not pictured but with details similar to version 2. Dark rosewood finish, \$335

Session 2 - afternoon. Participants will assemble a single tree table.

The three different sizes and styles are appropriate for trees from shohin to chuhin bonsai. All are mortise and tenon, frame and floating panel construction. (Only version 1, below, is still available.)

Version 1 - 1 are available, see *picture to left*. 14" x 10" x 8" high. Walnut with a dark rosewood finish. \$200

SHOHIN BONSAI FEATURE OF THE MONTH



Mame Shohin Bonsai Japanese Flowering Quince

This bonsai is a Slanting style, because the Apex extends out beyond the edge of the root system. The trunk has good taper from the ground to the apex and the Pink flowers are clearly the Focal Point. This bonsai is a great example of using texture for visual interest. The neutral color of the pot does not compete with the flowers for attention. The visual texture of the striped pattern on the pot creates an interesting contrast with the texture created by the mass of Pink flowers. The visual contrast of the textures is created between the soft irregular form created by the group of flowers and the more rigid geometric pattern of the stripes and the shape of the pot.
