Next Meeting

Tuesday, January 28, 2025 at 7:00 pm

This is a wonderful opportunity for our members to hear from and watch one of our founding members. Harvey Carapella has been a Bonsai hobbyist since 1979 (46 years!) Harvey will present a Lecture on Balance, Color and Perspective in Bonsai. Harvey was an Assistant Professor at RIT for 45 years teaching Basic Design and Basic Drawing, so we will enjoy a very polished and professional presentation. In addition to his professorship, Harvey has been a Freelance Graphic Designer/Illustrator at RIT for 36 years, He is also a past president of this club for over 20 years, a Nationally recognized award winning Bonsai artist and the Art Director and Designer of International Bonsai Magazine. You don't want to miss this!

Harvey gives us an overview of his talk:

In my Shohin Bonsai comments, I often use the term Balance and refer to Color relationships between pot, tree, fruit and flowers. Of all the elements of Design, Balance is the one that has the most application to bonsai design and can help in determining, for example, how much to prune, where to prune, tree to pot proportions etc.

The second presentation and also an element of design, is Color. In many cases we use it based on our feelings, what we like and don't like, but don't really understand why the color combinations we picked work together, or don't work together to give us the effect we are after.

If time permits, a 3rd presentation Perspective in Bonsai, how to create the illusion of space and distance in a small area, like our pots for group plantings. Hopefully these presentations will give some insights and help in creating and improving the quality of your Bonsai.

I like to "water" with light fluffy snow if possible but will also pack a handful of heavy snow if that is what's available. Last winter I mostly hand watered with a watering can with a long thin neck but it takes a very long time. Also remember to check for any sign of rodents and act swiftly to eliminate the threat.

On another note, studying photos of your own trees can be helpful in learning what can improve and make notes on each tree and also assess the current pot and potting position. Another reminder, you have one of the largest Club Bonsai Libraries in the country at your disposal, plan to take out a book or two. Often you will find a tree that reminds you of one of yours but see Ideas you can use to elevate your own Bonsai!

We have a new Shohin Study Group Leader who I will announce at the January meeting and I am excited to see the group get active again!


Also remember we change our membership year so dues are NOW Due.

SHOHIN BONSAI FEATURE OF THE MONTH



Shohin Bonsai, Variety: Pyracantha

A powerful little Semi Cascade tree with a powerful twisting trunk. It is a Semi Cascade, because the Apex extends out beyond the rootball and the horizontal branch does not drop below the upper lip of the pot. This is Fall, so the Red berries are the Focal Point, in Spring the Focal Point will be the small White flowers. The White flowers will also complement the White background of the ornate pot. The tree is potted dead center, which it should be, because it is in a symmetrical round pot. The only problem is the one leg in front, I prefer to see two legs for better stability, but when there is a feature on the surface of the pot it can be difficult to use the two legs and have the feature in the best location.
