## SHOHIN BONSAI FEATURE OF THE MONTH



### Shohin Bonsai, Variety: Japanese Flowering Apricot

It's a Mame size Shohin bonsai or "Bean Size". Style wise, it's a Semi Cascade. Which is the Focal Point, the flowers or the great little textured pot? Usually it would be the flowers, but this pot is so eye catching it is demanding your attention, so I would say it is the Focal Point. I wish it was potted in the center of the round pot, but more than likely the roots probably wouldn't cooperate. The White background of the pot harmonizes nicely with the White flowers. They balance each other, the eye moves back and forth between the two White elements, which creates an overall visual connection between them. — — - Harvey Carapella
