6:30 pm- we'll start appetizers, with the club providing shrimp, as usual. Please bring a dish to pass: either an appetizer, a side dish, or a dessert. **7:00 pm -** we'll get dinner going. The Suiseki study group will meet on Saturday, June 14 at 1 pm, at Bob Blankfield's home. Members are encouraged to bring a stone, and share their story about the stone.

The group will meet again on Saturday, July 26, at 1 pm, at Les Allen's home in Erie, PA.

This year's Tanseki walk will be on August 9 at 10 am. When you sign up to participate you will be given the directions to the location. We always follow this fun event with lunch (dutch treat) and discussion. Email sign up will be announced in July. This is a very special event, with camaraderie, shared expertise on suiseki and collecting, and a lovely day outside in the heart of our beautiful Finger Lakes.

During the US National Exhibition, on Sunday, September 14, Les Allen will lead a guided tour of the Suiseki portion of the exhibit, with a discussion of the stones and their stories.

Club Picnic and Auction - things to know

How does the Club picnic, Auction and Yard Sale work? A bit of a refresher for members old and new.

First, find your extras and bring them: pots, trees, books, magazines, all Bonsai related. Clean them up, look them over and see the section below about anything that is of higher value.

Bring your things to Buckland Lodge on June 24. To sell items directly, bring a table and set up outside the Lodge any time from about 5:30 on until the auction starts, about 7:30.

Register as a seller at the auction with treasurer Diane Koretz, and also get a bidder number. The proceeds from the auction items will be paid to the club, and then Diane will send you the sale amount less 20%. You MAY volunteer that the entire proceeds stay with the Club - do that when you register.

Use your bidder number at the auction to get yourself some new bonsai items AND support your club!

NEW LAST YEAR, and it worked, so repeating this year! In acknowledging feedback from prior years' auctions, we've noted people saying "I love the auction, but I wish, . . ." Sellers have said "I have a really nice tree or a special high quality pot I'd love to sell but I don't want to have to let it go for a fraction of its worth!" And potential buyers have said "I already have a handful of young trees in early development but I'd love to have a chance to buy a tree that's already well-developed, and for a fair price!" Is this possible?? This seemed to work last year, so here we go again

With this year's picnic just a few weeks away, we'll allow sellers to place a reserve price on select items, with a reasonable expectation that the eventual auction price would achieve that reserve price or more. Such a "reserve" status will be allowed on items reasonably expected to sell for \$300 and above.

Sellers wishing to utilize this reserve bidding process will need to meet with the auctioneer and another Board member before the auction (maybe over a bite of shrimp or two!) to mutually agree on a fair reserve price for their item(s). Sellers are still welcome to use our traditional "yard sale" style market outside the lodge entrance prior to the picnic and auction. What is left unsold by picnic time is (as always) more than welcome to be included in the auction sale.

PLEASE REMEMBER TO REGISTER AS A SELLER AT THE AUCTION TABLE SO THAT YOUR ITEMS CAN BE TRACKED AND TO ALLOW YOUR BEING PAID APPROPRIATELY.

SHOHIN BONSAI FEATURE OF THE MONTH



A historic Shohin Bonsai Japanese Maple

The original tree is on the top. It's being developed as an Informal Upright, but I feel the foliage and branching growing upward and to the left is moving the eye away from the Informal Upright shape. It's creating an openness to the lower half of the tree and visually cutting it in half. My suggestions are in the bottom photo, a combination of pruning back and wiring the upper branches downward creating a more compact tree. With these corrections I feel the tree works as one now and doesn't feel like it is being cut in half visually. The foliage is no longer all at the top, but has a better distribution and balance creating a smaller tree and a more convincing Informal Upright. — *Harvey Carapella*

This famous shohin bonsai has been container grown for about 130 years. I was fortunate to add it to my collection in 1985 and it has been displayed around the country. Harvey's two photos are from 1973. Below is a more recent photo. Check out the development on the next page. - Bill Valavanis

Development Of A Japanese Maple From The Matsudaira Shohin Bonsai Collection

I obtained this shohin Japanese bonsai from the Matsudaira Shohin Bonsai Collection in February 1985, but could not afford the unglazed round shallow container. This bonsai has been turned around several times in its 128 years of training. I was acting as a "curator" trying to maintain the original design when purchased. In 2005 I decided to change the design and added several branches by inarch grafting. As can be noticed my new design is very similar to the original design by the Matsudairas as seen in 1973. It was displayed in the 1957 and 1974 Kokufu Bonsai Exhibitions.
