### Here's what to know about our upcoming Club Show

First and foremost: get at least one tree ready to display in the show. We want every club member to bring a tree and/or a suiseki to display - remember this is the 50th anniversary year for our Club.

**Second**: help us promote the show. The pictures to the right are from the Asian Pacific Heritage Event at the Memorial Art Gallery last year. This year's event is this Sunday, May 7, beginning at noon. Bring your friends and see fellow Club members Harvey Carapella, Mark Arpag, Rick Marriott and others with a small display of trees, and LOTS of promotion for the Club Show on May 21. You can also help promote the show by putting up the poster in highly visible locations - get them from Bill. And you can buy and sell tickets to the show - see below.

**Third:** plan to come on Saturday May 20 from 4:30 - 7 to bring your tree(s) and suiseki and help set up the show. We need everyone there to get the show set up quickly.

**Fourth:** come to the show on Sunday, May 21, starting at 9. We need a few people at 8 to help with finishing touches - please let us know if you are available. Then, during the show, Club members will help guide visitors and answer questions about Bonsai. The Show will close at 5, and we need a dozen people to help pack up and put things away. Again, please let us know if you can help with this.

**Fifth:** buy tickets for the show, at half price (ten tickets for \$35.00). They you can give them to your friends and family, or you can sell them at full price (\$7.00 each.) What a fantastic example of what is available to use with your Shohin Bonsai. If it looks expensive, it probably is, the size of the pot doesn't matter, it's who made it, how old it is and/or the history behind it that makes them so expensive. Many times it's the ornateness of a pot that makes a Shohin Bonsai interesting and exciting to look at. There is a great deal of flexibility with the smaller trees that is not there with the larger trees. It's one of the most important elements that make Shohin Bonsai fun to work with.
