Shohin Bonsai Japanese White 5 Needle Pine

This Informal Upright Pine has a massive feel, even for a small tree. The foliage is very full, you can only see a couple of branches, no negative space to see through the tree making the silhouette of the tree the Focal Point. Making the foliage silhouette the most important feature instead of the branches and foliage is a personal choice, some like it, some don't. It's also a good solution for a tree that has poor branch structure but good foliage mass. The foliage mass has a good triangular shape and the quiet Reddish Brown pot is a good choice to contrast with the bright Green foliage, they compliment each other in a subtle way. Where if it was a bright Red and bright Green it would be a dramatic Direct Complimentary color combination.
